The course offers:

- Excellent preparation to teach all National Curriculum subjects
- Opportunity to train as a teacher in the primary phase with a specialism in Special Educational Needs, Disabilities and Inclusion
- This pathway will enable you to develop a deeper understanding and knowledge of working with children with disabilities, within mainstream and Special School or specialist provision settings
- A grounding in primary pedagogy across the curriculum
- Research-informed teaching
- Access to subject and priority area specialists

During the course, you will:

- Apply theoretical and practical knowledge and understanding of how children learn and develop in classroom settings
- Manage different patterns of organisation and styles of teaching to best support effective learning and provide equality of opportunity for all children
- Develop an understanding of SEND through the application of inclusive teaching practices
- Develop and demonstrate the knowledge, skills and teaching competence which will enable you to observe, plan, teach, organise and assess children's progress and learning across the full primary range
- Develop a clear framework for your own professional values and demonstrate a critical and reflective attitude towards your practice
- Evaluate sequences of learning and their impact on pupil progress, linking it to current education research
